

Brief History of Athens State University

In December of 1822, a group of citizens from Athens, Alabama, had a vision for an institute of higher learning to serve the educational needs of the women in the community. After five acres of land was purchased and a single building was built, Athens Female Academy was born and the storied history that would eventually lead to the creation of Athens State University began.

In 1842, ownership of the school was transferred to the Tennessee Conference of the Methodist Church. With the switch, Athens Female Academy became Athens Female Institute. This name remained throughout the conflict of the Civil War and through the birth of the North Alabama Conference of the Methodist Church in 1870, when the Institution came under the jurisdiction of that body. Following this transfer to the newly formed conference, the name was again changed to Athens Female College in 1889.

Following changes in social mores and community needs, Athens Female College was transformed into a co-educational institution of higher learning in 1931 and became known as Athens College. More than 40 years later, on May 10, 1974, the Athens College Board of Trustees requested from the North Alabama Conference of the United Methodist church that the Institution be allowed to seek affiliation with the State of Alabama. At its annual meeting in June of that same year, the conference signed off on the transfer and Athens College was officially approved to become a public institution of higher learning.

A year later, in June 1975, the Alabama State Board of Education accepted Athens College into the state educational system. Following its acceptance, the Alabama State Legislature appropriated funds for the operation of the newly minted Athens State College to serve the graduates of state junior, community, and technical colleges and institutes. Finally, in 1998, a bill was passed to rename the College as Athens State University to reflect its growth and change over the years. On October 1, 2012, Athens State University transitioned to a new governance structure under an independent Board of Trustees and no longer under the oversight of the Alabama State Board of Education.

As the only institution in the state of Alabama offering upper division degree programs and services, Athens State University continues to enjoy the important and unique position that it has always occupied within the community. With a firm history upon which to build its foundation, Athens State's colorful past has supplied the Institution with the tools necessary to continue serving Alabama far into the future.


Athens State University Strategic Plan – Reaching toward 2020 2012-2015

Academic Year: A period of time, often used for reporting, made up of a consecutive Fall, Spring and Summer semester. The academic year is often referred to using the year associated with the Spring and Summer terms (e.g., academic year 2012-2013 may also be referred to as academic year 2013).

Admissions Rate: The percentage of applicants that were accepted for admission in any given period of time.

Admitted Student: Any applicant that has been granted admission and has received an official offer to enroll.

Applicant: Any individual seeking admission for the first time that has submitted an application package and application fee.

Census Date: The official reporting date for University data reports to IPEDS and ACHE.

Cohort: A group of people with a common characteristic (e.g., all students who entered the institution during the same academic year) established for tracking purposes.

Completers: Graduates.

Cross Listed Class: A class that has students enrolled under two or more unique course reference numbers and subject codes. This can sometimes occur when a class is offered through the cooperation of multiple departments or schools.

Distance Learning (DL): Distance Learning (DL) includes fully online and blended courses and is a formal educational process in which the majority of the instruction (interaction between students and instructors and among students) in a course occurs when students and instructors are not in the same place. Instruction may be synchronous or asynchronous. Interaction between the instructor and the student is regular and substantive, and can be initiated by the instructor or the student.

DL-Blended Course: A type of class that combines traditional classroom instruction and online education, where 50% or less of the class is delivered face-to-face and the rest is completed online.

DL-Online Course: A class taught 100% online using a combination of asynchronous and synchronous activities with online exams delivery based on university-approved processes that include authentication of online test takers, use of online proctoring tools, or use of live local proctors.

Enrolled Student: A student currently registered for class(es).

Faculty Credit Hour Production: Total credit hours taught by faculty in a given period.

Fiscal Year: Funding year that runs October 1 through September 30.

Full-Time (FT) Faculty: Any full time employee holding faculty rank.

Full-Time (FT) Student: A student enrolled in 12 or more semester hours.

Graduation Rate: The percent of degree-seeking students that completed bachelor's degree requirements at Athens State University up to 6 years out.

Headcount: Unduplicated count of registered students. (See Unduplicated)

Instructional Method: Primary method or technology used to deliver course instruction, information, and communication (delivery mode) between instructors and students. There are four course delivery modes: Distance Learning (DL); DL-Blended; Traditional Hybrid; and Traditional (Face-to-Face).

Merit-Based Financial Aid: Aid in the form of scholarships and grants <u>not</u> awarded on the basis of demonstrated financial need (Non Need-Based).

Need-Based Financial Aid: Aid in the form of scholarships, grants, and/or loans awarded to students on the basis of demonstrated financial need.

New Student: A student admitted and registered for class(es) for the first time.

Non-Degree Seeking Student: A student enrolled in classes but not seeking a degree such as taking courses conducive to a certificate in a discipline or complying with course requirements needed to obtain teacher certification by the State. (Rev. December 2013)

Part-Time (PT)/Adjunct Faculty: Non-tenure track faculty serving in a temporary or auxiliary capacity to teach specific courses on a course-by-course, term-by-term basis.

Part-Time (PT) Student: Students enrolled in fewer than 12 semester hours.

Returning Student: A previously enrolled student that is currently registered for class(es).

Section/Class: A section is a course assigned a unique Course Reference Number (CRN); whereas, a class is one or more sections of a course with multiple CRNs in cases involving cross-listed courses.

Student Full Time Equivalent (FTE): Full-time equivalent enrollment calculated by term and by year using the following formulas, respectively:

Student FTE (by Term) = Total semester credit hours divided by 15. (Alabama Commission on Higher Education definition) Student FTE (12-month) = Annual undergraduate credit hours divided by 30. (IPEDS definition)

Student-to-Faculty Ratio (IPEDS definition): Student FTE divided by Faculty FTE, where,

Student FTE = FT Students + (number of PT undergraduate students divided by 3) and Faculty FTE = FT Faculty + (number of PT faculty divided by 3)

Student Retention Rate (Fall-to-Fall): The percentage of students from the initial cohort (new students each fall term) returning the following fall term. Students who graduate during the initial academic year and other exclusions apply, and therefore, are not included in the calculation. (The Retention rate is different from the Persistence rate since only new students are included in this calculation.)

Student Persistence Rate (Fall to Spring): The percentage of students from the initial cohort (all students enrolled each Fall term) who return in the Spring term. Students who graduate during the initial term are not included in the calculation. (The Persistence rate is different from the Retention rate. All students, not just new students, are included in this calculation).

Traditional Course: A course taught in a face-to-face classroom setting.

Traditional/Hybrid Course: A course taught primarily in a face-to-face setting with 49% or less of the coursework delivered through technology, usually with 25% of the course delivered through various modes of technology.

Transient Student: A student that is visiting for a term, taking one or more courses approved by their home institution for transfer back into their degree program to be awarded by their home institution. (Rev. December 2013)

Unduplicated: The sum of students enrolled for credit with each student counted only once during the reporting period regardless of the number of classes or terms in which they were enrolled. (See Headcount)

Veteran Student: A student claiming veteran status (non-active) from any of the branches of the armed forces and a recipient of GI Bill benefits.













Enrollment by College Fall 2013







Credit Hour Production & Full-time Equivalent Students by College Fall 2013














Annual Completions by Race & Gender Summer 2012, Fall 2012, Spring 2013




Athens State University Employees by Occupational Code Fall 2013


Athens State University Employees by Gender and Race/Ethnicity Fall 2013









Athens State University Race/Ethnicity by Full-Time Faculty, Deans & Librarians







Athens State University Full-Time Faculty by Academic Rank & Gender Fall 2013
