

The Bicentennial staff, in conjunction with our Marketing department, has completed ten interviews of alumni and friends of the University with a number of additional ones scheduled. The silent phase of the \$20 million Capital Campaign continues with gifts and pledges totaling \$1,414,412.58. We are working with major gift prospects that are capable of making six and seven figure gifts to the campaign and anticipate making significant progress as we move forward. Final versions of collateral materials for the campaign are at the printer and will be available on Friday, July 20, 2018. We are also working on final edits for our Bicentennial/Campaign website.

COB: The College of Business in collaboration with the College of Arts & Sciences served as a sponsor of the National Cyber Security Summit on June 6-7, 2018. This supports our pursuit as a NSA Center of Excellence designation.

COE: The College of Education participated in Faculty Led summer experiences June 18-29. The host sites included Athens Elementary and Athens Intermediate Schools and FE Burleson and Crestline Elementary Schools in Hartselle. Students were also placed at Madison Elementary, Columbia Elementary, and James Clemons High School. Over 170 students in communities we serve benefitted from the summer experiences.

SEEKING ACCREDITATION

COB: The College is seeking updated accreditation from ACBSP for the B.S. in Information Assurance and the M.S. in Global Logistics and Supply Chain Management. The Self-Study was submitted last week. An ACBSP visiting team is scheduled to be on our campus in October of this year.

COAS: ABET Accreditation – Concerns addressed by ABET visiting team have been addressed and rectified by the Computer Science Department in the College of Arts & Sciences and submitted to ABET. A final report is expected from ABET at the end of July.

PARTNERING

LIBRARY: The Library is in the process of renewing or initiating reciprocal borrowing contracts with schools in the state and surrounding area. Reciprocal borrowing contracts allow the students, faculty and staff of the agreed institutions to use each other's facilities and check out books. The contract allows the students to use the collections, databases, and reference assistance from the contracted institution free. This means a student will be able to walk into a library, use a computer, look up articles, and ask questions in person. This will allow our distance education students access to a physical library, materials, and personnel if they are having research issues or just want a quiet space to study. We currently have reciprocal borrowing partnerships with the following:

- 10 two-year institutions
- 4 four-year institutions

We expect to have signed reciprocal contracts with 4 additional two-year institutions and 2 additional four-year institutions by August.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

ITS and ATS staff completed 7,996 Help Desk tickets between June 2017 and July 2018 for students, faculty, and staff.

The ATS instructional design team and faculty have produced 11 new or redesigned courses since July 2017 that have received Quality Matters certification.

The ITS team has made great progress on the Banner 9 system implementation. The test instance of the new system was brought online in June.

ITS staff began the first Banner 9 user training sessions the week of July 16.

ITS staff have finalized the implementation of the new perimeter firewalls in December 2017.

ITS staff have been working on the Quick Launch single sign-on project since January.

Lynn Frank has transitioned to instructional designer full time in ATS. Lynn's previous position, User Support and Help Desk Serviced Coordinator, is being advertised now with a close date of July 24, 2018.

Christen Stephens joined ATS as Instructional Design Technician in March 2018.

Gary McCullors has been designated as the university's information security officer (ISO) with continuing duties as Director of Information Technology Services.

ITS staff will provide support at the Cyber Forensics Camp sponsored by the Huntsville chapter of InfraGard and the FBI for middle-school aged children on July 27, 2018.

The technicians in ITS are finalizing the installation of approximately 128 new computers in computer labs, the library, Testing Center, and faculty/staff offices as part of the first year central computer replacement budget.

Enrollment numbers are holding steady with the continued improvement in employment. The US economy added 213,000 jobs in June, 2018 while the unemployment rate moved to 4% and average hourly earnings increased by 2.7%. The unemployment rate for those with some college or an Associate's degree was 3.3% according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Alabama continues to have an unemployment rate below 4% and added 22,900 jobs since May, 2017.

Newly admitted UG students are up 4.3% and Newly Enrolled UG students are up 9.1%, while our returning students are down by 2.4% and graduate numbers are a reflection of no new program offerings.
