The 2018 National SHRM Conference and Exposition was held in Chicago, IL. In addition to our chapter advisors, Dr. Gary Huckaby and Dr. Kim LaFevor, two of our student members attended the conference: Jeremy Boles and Diana Woodward. Many organizations showcased their products to advertise options for employee wellness and benefits as well as management technologies and consultation services. There were many concurrent sessions that focused on every aspect of the SHRM BoCK (Body of Competencies and Knowledge); just a few of the session topics that we were able to attend focused on employee motivation, legal compliance, incorporation of various electronic platforms for recruitment, and basics of recruiting for those in entry level positions. Sheryl Sandberg, COO of Facebook, was a highly anticipated keynote speaker for this event. Her message was about the position of women in the workplace and how women should not be confined by a “glass ceiling” but empowered to achieve and thrive in demanding positions. She stated that the perspective of women in the workplace should change so that a woman in upper management is not seen as an oddity in corporate culture.

- Must be in their final year of study in the HR degree program
- Must have a minimum of 500 hours of relevant HR experience
