

**Excellent Teaching Opportunities!
Summer Field Experience 2015**

**Looking for a great field experience opportunity! Look no further!
Students are needed to teach at several of our summer programs!**

The following camps are part of Athens State University's College of Education summer field experience opportunities. Each camp offers excellent teaching experiences that will enhance your skills and your resume. Sign up will be completed using a Doodle link for each camp. Because the number of participants is limited, Athens State students will be allowed to sign up based on the following schedule:

May 4-12: Component 3 Instructor Led – Students in the following courses are expected to complete component 3 Instructor Led field experience: SE 435, EL 420, ER 319, SC 331, AR 455, and HPE 430. These students will sign up for their choice of camps to work three or four consecutive days to fulfill this requirement. These days do not count towards component 1 field experience. This sign up will be on a first come, first serve basis. The sign up information will be shared through the above courses' Blackboard containers.

May 4-21: ED 303: Students who wish to take ED 303 should sign up for the section associated with the camp they choose. ED 303 is a one hour credit course intended to help fulfill elective hours of programs with 19, 4, or 13 credit hours of electives. Any COE students may take ED 303. These days do not count towards component 1 field experience.

May 13-May 21: Component 1 – Students who need component 1 field experience days may sign up for the camp of their choice based on availability. This will be on a first come, first serve basis. The sign up information will be shared via email.

Tanner Summer Enrichment Program

Tanner's summer enrichment program focuses on reading and math integrated into a unit of study. The program's emphasis is on hands-on activities in a literature-rich environment. ASU students have a unique opportunity to plan and teach lessons with the guidance and support of ASU professors and master teachers. The Tanner program is divided into three

classes by grade levels, 1, 2-3, and 4-5. The program runs from 8:00 to 1:00 each day for two weeks, M-Th. ASU students are required to be onsite from 7:30-1:30. A debriefing of the day's activities is held from 1:00-1:30 each day. ASU students are required to come to one day of orientation lasting 3 hours and must help take-down and pack up materials at the end of the two weeks. The Tanner program will run from June 15-June 25, 2015.

Madison City Extended School Year Program Summer 2015

Madison City Schools provides extended school year programs for approximately 60-70 elementary- age students with disabilities which is located at Mill Creek Elementary School and 10-15 secondary- age students with disabilities which is located at James Clements High School. At the Mill Creek Elementary School there will be inclusive classes, preschool special education classes, and classes for students with developmental disabilities. At

James Clements High School there will be a program which involves community-based instruction for students with developmental disabilities. ASU students will have an opportunity to plan and teach lessons/activities with the guidance and support of ASU faculty and master teachers. ASU students are required to be on site from 7:30 to 12:30 each day. There will be a debriefing each day from 12:30 to 1:00. The program operates Monday through Friday.
