PROPOSAL #1

With regard to the minor in educational technology: the request is that ED 305 Technology & Media be added to the multi-media electives list.

Approved by majority vote. (11-12-14)

PROPOSAL #2

With regard to the College of Education courses: the request is to change the course descriptions in the catalog. The course description statement is as follows: "Course requirements include mandatory campus-based training. Consult the College of Education calendar of events webpage for more information". The courses affected are ED 301, ED 302, EL 420, EL 324, ER 430, ER 323, ER 330, HPE 430, SC 333, SE 435, EL 420, AR 455, and ER 319.

PROPOSAL #3

With regard to the Early Childhood minor: the request was to revise the ECE minor by removing all 100 -200 level courses as electives except for CHD 201 Child Growth and Development.

PROPOSAL #4

With regard to the Secondary mathematics, biology, chemistry, English, history, social sciences, and art education plans of study: the request is to replace the requirement of "United States history course (Area IV)" with "at least one history course". Students must complete a 6-hour sequence in literature (Area II) or history (Area IV).

PROPOSAL #5

With regard to the Biology major: the request is to expand the options from BI 470 Biology Capstone to BI 470 Research Thesis Capstone. Addition of the option to complete a research thesis will encourage student research and increase the opportunities of our biology graduates.

With regard to the Track I (math only) plan of study and Track II (secondary mathematics education) plan of study:
