Alabama's Regional Inservice Centers (ARIC) were created by the state legislature in 1984 to enhance the professional learning of public school teachers and administrators, in areas essential for improving student achievement. The Alabama Legislature, seeing the effective and unique plan for the regional delivery of professional development for all educators, has continued that support each year.

Each Center is housed in an institution of higher education and is governed by a 16-member board of which a majority are K-12 teachers and administrators. In 1987, the Alabama State Board of Education initiated oversight of the Regional Inservice Centers. This oversight includes specific Accountability Standards in the areas of fiscal, government, and programmatic responsibilities. The Accountability Standards for Alabama's Regional Inservice Centers, which were revised in 1992 and 2003, represent a model of accountability and evaluation for a state entity. The Regional Inservice Centers are efficient and effective in meeting the professional development needs of public school teachers and administrators.





The Alabama Department of Education (SDE) collaborates with the Regional Inservice Centers to implement and facilitate regional and state-wide professional development programs for teachers and administrators such as:


